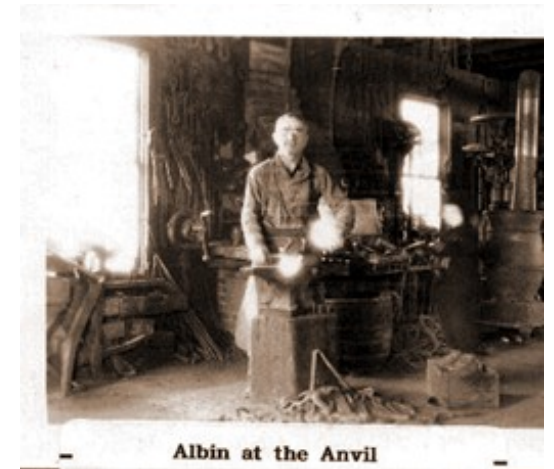
LISTEN CAREFULLY TO THE HARDSHIPS EACH FACED. SOME FROM NATURE. SOME FROM PEOPLE.

Tidbit: Liverpool was the first township permanently settled in Medina County. Seba Bronson, Jr squatted at Hardscrabble (Columbia & Grafton Roads) early in 1810. The Warners soon followed.
